- B) Germany after the Nazis came to power in 1933. Are the following statements True or False?
  - 1) The word Holocaust means 'causing fear' FALSE [it means: mass burning / whole burning]
  - 2) Over 250 synagogues were vandalized and set on fire in the November Pogrom on 9<sup>th</sup> November 1938 **TRUE** [Jewish homes, business and cemeteries were also attacked]
  - 3) The November Pogrom is also known as Kristallnacht which means 'Silent Night' **FALSE** [it means: Night of Broken Glass or Crystal Night]
  - 4) Jewish people had to pay a heavy fine for the damage caused in the November Pogrom TRUE
  - 5) Jewish business were closed down at the end of 1938 TRUE
  - 6) Jewish children were expelled from German state schools in November 1938 TRUE
  - 7) Jews were forced to move out of their homes and go into specific 'Jewish houses' to make it easier to deport them. TRUE [this happened in December 1938]
  - 8) Jewish people were transported in trains inside crowded cattle-trucks to labour and death camps. Many were shot when they arrived. **TRUE**
  - 9) From 1942 death camps were used to murder Jews by gassing them in 'gas chambers'. TRUE
  - 10) Towards the end of the war, thousands of Jewish people were liberated by the Germans, given food, clothing and medical help. FALSE [The camps were liberated by American, British or Russian soldiers, depending on where they were situated. Before liberation, thousands were taken out of the camps by the Germans and forced to walk back towards Germany in so-called 'death marches'. Already weakened by illness and starvation, many died in the freezing weather. If they could not keep up, they were shot or just left behind.]
