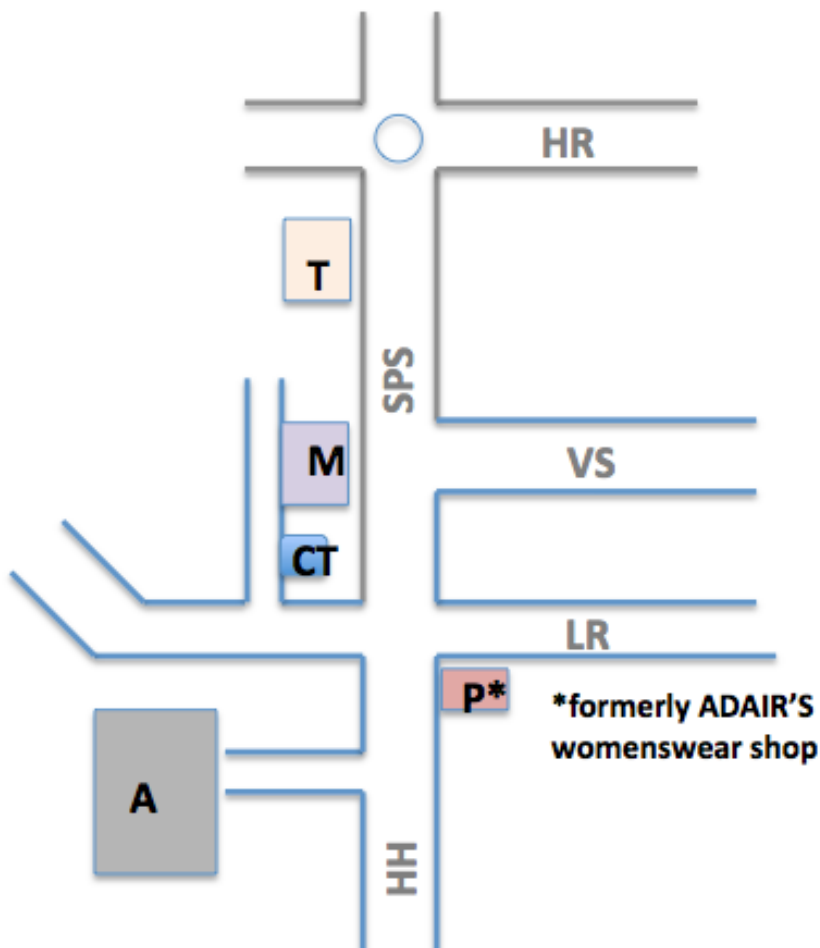
B) Look at the key to the map. Find the answers to the following. The first letter of each answer will help to make a word which is a type of old-fashioned shop. Two are done for you.
