- 1) Kitty Hart-Moxon had a tattoo burnt on to her arm when she arrived at the Auschwitz **(DEATH)/EXTERMINATION** camp. (The word means 'destruction'.)
- 2) Helen's mother Hanna arrived in England as part of the **KINDERTRANSPORT** programme to bring unaccompanied children out of Germany.
- 3) David and Norma's pictures show us two versions of a Ketubah which is an engagement, wedding, or **MARRIAGE** certificate.
- 4) Marshall Colman's grandfather worked in a factory that made **CIGARETTES**
- 5) The World War Two singer remembers that she was given a **BULLET** by Clive Cohen's father who was an army doctor.
- 6) Brian Davis has his grandfather's certificate signed by the famous wartime leader **WINSTON CHURCHILL** who was then the Secretary of State (in charge of the Home Office).
- 7) A document confirming that someone had been given British citizenship was called a **NATURALIZATION** certificate. **[The word can also be spelled with an S instead of a Z]**
- 8) Helen's father was given a camera as a present for his **BAR MITZVAH**. He used this to take a hands-free timer photo, a feature which was quite unusual and advanced in the 1930s.
- 9) Sylvia's seaside photo shows her step-grandfather Otto who was the father of **ANNE FRANK**, the famous young victim of the Holocaust who wrote a diary whilst in hiding in Amsterdam.
- 10) The football shirt on Jon's page is a reminder of a football exchange started by his father between the school where he taught in North Manchester and his old school in the German town of **COLOGNE**
